## A GUIDE TO CONGESTION IN THE UK

In the UK, the INRIX 2016 Traffic Scorecard analysed congestion in 87 cities and large urban areas. The visualisation below shows the ranking of UK cities by the number of peak hours the average commuter spent in congestion. It also includes the economic cost of congestion per driver and the total cost per city in 2016. London tops the list of the UK's most congested cities, with congestion costing drivers in the capital £1,911 each in 2016 and more than £6 billion across the city as a whole.
